

General Guidelines

We publish articles that include a humanistic perspective of all areas of occupational therapy. This includes articles that contribute to the further development of occupational therapy (e.g. new methods, theories, research reports, developments in the field of education and practice) or that provide an insight into the practical and scientific work of occupational therapists. It is necessary to contact the editorial team to arrange the terms concerning the date of publication. Articles that are sent spontaneously or at the last minute are taken into consideration whenever possible. We only accept previously unreleased articles that are not offered to any other journal at the same time. Reprints are arranged separately.

Structural Guidelines

Prior to the article an abstract (max. 250 words) of it has to be sent to the editor per mail. Articles have to be written in Word and sent to redaktion@ergotherapie.at. The article has to include an abstract with a maximum of 250 words.

Integration of Charts, Graphs and Figures

Figures are possible in black-and-white or color. Pictures, tables etc. must be added in a separate file. Pictures have to be sent in original size (between 300 KB and 3 MB)

Length of texts

Please consider the following guidelines concerning the length of the texts:

- Articles on key topics: max. 4-6 printed pages or about 18,000-27,000 characters including spaces, without figures
- Articles beyond the key topics: max. 4 printed pages or about 18,000 characters including spaces, without figures
- Project Reports: max. 2 printed pages or about 9,000 characters including spaces, without figures

Editorial reasons can lead to text reductions even though the author followed the guidelines concerning the lengths of the text. Such text reductions, however, have to be arranged between the editorial team and the author. For best planning, please inform the editorial team of your rough number of printed pages as soon as it can be estimated. In reasonable cases and according to prior agreement with the editorial team, we also publish longer articles.

Contact Details

At the end of the article please enclose your name, title, institution, city as well as a picture of yourself. You can also include your telephone number and email address if you wish. It is, of course, acceptable if you do not wish to send a picture of yourself.

- Books from one author: last name of author, year of publication (e.g. Bauer, 2010)
- Books from two authors: last name of one author and last name of the other author, year of publication (e.g. Romein&Espei,2015)
- Books from more than two authors: last name of the first author et al.; year of publication (e.g. Palisano et al., 2011)

If the quotation is directly please add the exact page number. (e.g. Stadler-Grillmaier,2007, p 102)

At the end of the text

- Books from one author: last name of author, initial of first name. (year of publication). title: subtitle. city: publisher. (e.g. Hagedorn, R. (2005). Foundations for practice in occupational therapy. Amsterdam: Elsevier.
- Books from more than one author: last name of author, initial of first name & last name of author, initial of first name. (year of publication). title: subtitle. city: publisher. (e.g. Dreyfus, h. L. & Dreyfus, S. E. (1987). Artificial intelligence. Reinbek by Hamburg: Rowohlt.
- Book from a collection: last name of the author from the part of the collection, initial of the first name. (year of publication). title of the collection. editor, initial of the editors first name, title (number of pages). year of publication: publisher. (e.g. Heller, B. (2015). treatment processes. in Becker, H. & Steding-Albrecht, U. (editor), OT in pediatrics (p 91-108). Stuttgart: Thieme.
- Articles from a magazine: last name of the author, initial of the first name. (year of publication). title from the article. title of the magazine, year of publishing (magazine number), pages – pages. (e.g. Dunst, C.J. & Bruder, M. B. (2005). University faculty preparation of students in using natural environment practices with young children. Psychological reports, 96(1), 239-242.
- Quotations from the internet: last name of the author, initial of first name or institution or group name...(year of publication). title of the online article. date of reading, by URL. (e.g. DACHS (2007). OT: definition/ description. read on 05/07/2017, by <http://www.dachs.it/de/kap-1.php>.

If the list of references cannot be printed completely, we offer readers the list of references in a separate file for download.

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Compensation

Authors get a compensation of 15 € for each printed page (approximately 4,500 characters including spaces, without figures)

CPD-Points

Authors receive a confirmation for their written articles. Articles with a minimum of two pages are given 5 CPD points according to the MTD-CPD guidelines.
